Dear Sisters and Brothers of the Susquehanna Conference,

The week following Annual Conference will be our conference’s opportunity to pray for the whole church and the Commission on A Way Forward. We believe that a praying way forward is indeed a way forward in unity.

I am also grateful that clergy members of our annual conference will preach at two of our worship services. The Rev. Dr. Charles Salisbury, York District Superintendent, will preach at the Memorial Service on Thursday evening. Pastor Kris Sledge will bring the message at Friday’s Celebration of Ministry Service. Bishop Cynthia Moore-Koikoi,

Bishop of the Western Pennsylvania Conference, will proclaim God's Word at the Ordination Service on Saturday afternoon. I know that we will be richly blessed by all of our conference speakers and preachers.
