

Stewardship Prayer

You may add other items as you feel led. In this prayer exercise, you are asked to read a Bible verse, say a focused prayer and then continue.

Matthew 6:33 "But seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be added to you."

Pray to ask God to organize your priorities.

Romans 12:2 "Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that by testing you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect."

Pray to ask God to organize and manage your thoughts.

Psalms 139:16 "Your eyes saw me when I was inside the womb. All the days ordained for me were recorded in your scroll before one of them came into existence."

Pray to ask God to organize and manage your time.

Ephesians 4:2-3 "Be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love. Make every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace."

Pray to ask God to organize and manage your relationships.

Ecclesiastes 5:15 "We all come to the end of our lives as naked and empty-handed as on the day we were born. We can't take our riches with us."

Pray to ask God to organize and manage your things.

Colossians 3:23 "Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord, not for human masters,"

Pray to ask God to organize and manage your work.

Proverbs 16:9 "A person plans his way, but the LORD directs his steps".

Pray to ask God to organize and manage your life.

Jeremiah 29:11 "For I know the plans I have for you," declares the LORD, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future."

Pray to ask God to organize and manage your future.

1 John 4:8 "Beloved, let us love one another, because love comes from God. Everyone who loves has been born of God and knows God."

Pray to ask God to organize and manage your heart.
