Only essential business was included. All items which did not require a vote were not mentioned.

The Report to the Clergy Session was presented, Bishop Park presiding. Any corrections of spelling, etc., should be given to Greg Myers in writing. Brian Lucas, Elder Registrar, presented the candidates for commissioning: Tammy J. Blose, Todd A. Christine, and Hannah P. Sledge. Those presented were approved as a group by the body by virtual vote. Brian then presented the candidates for ordination as Elder: Dilip R. Abayasekara, Denise M. Haskins, David J. Keyworth, John F. Mackey, Robert J. Marsh, and Timothy R. Parker. The body voted on each of these candidates individually and all were approved and received as full members of the annual conference.

The report was reviewed and voted upon as necessary. A record of the voting and vote totals were recorded electronically. A word of thanks was given to Greg Myers for his work in preparing this report.

Bishop Park then addressed the Clergy session. He gave words of hope and encouragement in this difficult time.

No further business appearing, the session was adjourned.

Worshipful Work Session I

Saturday Morning, October 3, 2020

A centering video by Jason Moore was shown as the 11th Session of the Susquehanna Annual Conference prepared to begin.

Bishop Jeremiah Park called the 11th session of the Susquehanna Annual Conference to order. He welcomed all to the first ever all virtual Annual Conference. He then thanked all those who worked tirelessly to enable this Annual Conference to happen; lifting up the Communications staff, IT staff, Sessions Committee and also recognizing there were many others involved in the preparation.

This was followed by an introduction of those assisting him and present including, Conference Secretary - Mrs. Cindy Weaver and Parliamentarian - Rev. Jennifer Williams, along with others. This was followed by the assurance that all those present were practicing social distancing. He pointed out that in 1804, the United Brethren Church, a predecessor church, faced an epidemic. Because of the epidemic only five people were able to attend the conference. He then welcomed all who were joining for the first time.

Bishop Park then introduced David Wood, Executive Director of GNTV, to give a brief review of the voting process with practice ballots.

Organizing the Annual Conference

After practice ballots were completed, the business of the day continued with the organizing of the Annual Conference. Mrs. Cindy Weaver lifted the revised Rules of Procedures and moved the adoption of the Rules of Procedures. The Bishop acknowledged a second and being properly before the body. A virtual vote was taken and posted, and the motion was **approved**.

Bishop Park called on Mrs. Cindy Weaver who announced that there is no consent calendar this year because it has been previously announced that this annual conference will be handling essential business only. For this reason, motions from the floor will not be in order.

With the Annual Conference being officially organized, Bishop Jeremiah Park called on Rev. Suzanne Elliot, Chair of the Board of Ordained Ministry, for any enabling motions. Rev. Suzanne Elliot moved the following: *I move that those ordained ministers from other Annual Conferences or Methodist denominations, who are approved for appointment in the Susquehanna Annual Conference while maintaining their conference or denominational membership, be granted voice at this Susquehanna Annual Conference. Those persons are: Janice M. Bye, M. Edwin Green III, William Jones, Melissa L. Madara, Tiffany L. Manning, Victoria A. Rebeck, Tennyson H. Rupnick, Jennifer T. Streeter, Kevin T. Witt, Ho Shik Kang.* A second was recognized by Bishop Park, a vote was taken, and the motion was **approved**.

The Bishop called on Rev. Suzanne Elliot to receive a second enabling motion which stated: *I move that Clergy in good standing in other Christian denominations who have been approved to serve appointment or ecumenical ministries within the bounds of the Susquehanna Annual Conference while maintaining their denominational membership, be granted voice and accorded voting rights within the Susquehanna Annual Conference. Those persons are: Brian M. Cieslukowski, Dorothy J. Densmore, Margaret M. McCarty, Joshua N. Rhone, Benjamin L. Scholl, Ronald E. Troup.* A second was recognized by Bishop Park, a vote was taken, and the motion was **approved**.

The Bishop called on Rev. Barry Robison, Dean of the Cabinet, who moved the adoption of the Agenda on behalf of the Agenda Committee. The motion came from a committee and did not require a second. Bishop Park called for the vote. The agenda was **Adopted**.

Conference Reports

Nominations Report

After the vote, the Bishop Park directed the body to turn to the reports and called on the chair of the Nominations Committee, Rev. Judi Herrold, to present the Nominations Report. The report was described by the reports and the variation on the ending and beginning of terms that occurred because of the pandemic where the General Conference is delayed for more than a year. Attention was drawn to the chat box, where changes to the report were posted.

Bishop Park called for nominations from the floor. With no nominations from the floor presented, Bishop Park closed the nominations. Rev. Michelle Bodle, chair of the Board of Pension and Health, offered corrections which were accepted by the Nominations Committee chair, Rev. Judi Herrold.

The Nominations Committee moved to approve the Nominations Report, as amended. The report was offered by the Nominations Committee, therefore, does not need a second. Bishop Park called for the vote. **Approved**.

Bishop Park thanked Rev. Judi Herrold, the Nominations Committee, and those working with them for their work.

Report from Big Picture Finance Team

Bishop Park then called on the Rev. Victoria Rebeck, Director of Connecting Ministries, to present the summary of the report of the Big Picture Finance Team. This team was made up of a group of people from various parts of the Finance and Administration leadership, a Cabinet representative, and the Director of Connectional Ministries. The team met several times over the past year and provided a report as a Zoom webinar in August. Rev. Victoria Rebeck offered a brief summary of the findings and results: 1) Equitable Compensations Commission is recommending no minimum salary increase for 2021. 2) Property and Casualty Insurance has increased an average of 18% in 2020. 3) Pension and Health for clergy is one hardest hit by rising costs and decreased funding. Health benefits to retired clergy is one of the single highest costs in Shares of Ministry. The Board of Pension and Health will propose to reduce the retiree health benefit by 20% in 2021. 4) Council on Finance and Administration lifts that the Conference has been able to do much more together than we could have individually. They also call on the individuals to strategically focus on what is most important in doing the work Jesus calls us to. Rev. Victoria Rebeck closed the report with encouragement from the Bishop and the reading of Jeremiah 29:11-12.

Bishop Park thanked Rev. Victoria Rebeck and the Big Picture Finance Team for their work and report stating that the report is for information only and does not require an action.

Bishop Park called for a break.

Report from Commission on Equitable Compensation

Bishop Park reconvened the session of Annual Conference and called on the chair of the Equitable Compensation Commission, Rev. William Pipp. Rev. Pipp announced that he will complete his term as Chair and Rev. John Overman will be the new chair of the commission. Rev. William Pipp first brought before the body, the recommendation that dealt with the compensation in 2021. The recommendation of the Commission is to have no increase in the minimum salary structure but encourage cost of living and merit increases. Rev. William Pipp moved the adoption of the Equitable Compensation report. He continued to draw attention to the revised Guidelines for Parsonage Standards guideline. The Equitable Compensation Commission moved the entire report. It comes from a committee, so it does not need a second. The Bishop called for the vote. It was **approved**.

Bishop Park thanked the Commission on Equitable Compensation for their work and cooperation. He also thanked Rev. William Pipp for his years of service and work with the Commission.

Report from Board of Pension and Health

Bishop Park called on the chair of the Board of Pension and Health, Rev. Michelle Bodle to present the board's report. Rev. Bodle first offered words of appreciation for Mr. Mark Knecht, Conference Treasurer/Conference Benefits Officer, and Rev. Jason Mackey, Benefits Administrator. She also thanked Mrs. Kelly Cox for her service as the former Benefits Administrator. Rev. Bodle then explained the board's decision for the proposal to cut retiree health care benefits by 20%, which can be found in the Council of Finance and Administration budget report.

On behalf of the Board of Pension and Health, Rev. Michelle Bodle moved to approve the setting of the annuity rate for pre-January 1, 1982, service at \$646 for calendar year 2021. This motion comes from a conference board, so it does not need a second. Bishop Park called for any questions. With no questions raised, Bishop Park called for the vote. It was **approved**.

On behalf of the Board of Pension and Health, Rev. Michelle Bodle moved the approval of the Board of Pensions report of the years of service and pension credit for those clergy who retired since the 2019 annual conference found on pages 23 and 24 in the Conference Workbook. This motion comes from a conference board, so it does not need a second. Bishop Park called for any questions. With no questions raised, Bishop Park called for the vote. It was **approved**.

On behalf of the Board of Pension and Health, Rev. Michelle Bodle moved the approval of the resolution on the rental/housing allowances for retired and disabled clergy of the Susquehanna Annual Conference found on page 24 in the Conference Workbook. This motion comes from a conference board, so it does not need a second. Bishop Park called for any questions. With no questions raised, Bishop Park called for the vote. It was **approved**.

Rev. Michelle Bodle continued the report by drawing attention to the fourth item in the report, the 2020 comprehensive funding plan, which was offered as a point of information.

The report concluded as Rev. Michelle Bodle offered thanks to Terry Shoemaker, who served as the Annual Conference liaison with WesPath, and is retiring. Thanks was also lifted for each member of the Board of Pension and Health.

An addendum to the report was given with an explanation of the Board of Pension and Health's decision regarding the future of retiree health care which will be presented at the 2021 Annual Conference. The motion will be as follows: Only those who are 65 years of age, or Medicare eligible before July 1, 2021 will be eligible to receive the Conference retiree benefit. The retiree's spouse will receive the benefit when they become eligible. Those who are not eligible to receive the benefit by 2021 will not receive the health benefit. Rev. Michelle Bodle expressed that this decision was reached with a heavy heart.

Bishop Park expressed his thanks to Rev. Michelle Bodle and the diligent work of the Board of Pension and Health. He also wanted to make clear that, while Rev. Michelle Bodle mentioned the separate matter of the Board of Pension and Health Benefits difficult decision to eliminate the supplemental health insurance premiums for future retirees in 2021, this is not a matter to be discussed or voted upon until the 2021 Annual Conference.

Report of the Council on Finance and Administration

The Bishop called on Rev. Dr. Timothy Baer, president of the Council on Finance and Administration (CF&A), to present CF&A's report. Rev. Dr. Timothy Baer thanked the churches, laity, and pastors for their faithfulness during the pandemic. He reported that receipts were down about four percent and expenses were reduced due to less meeting expenses, less office expenses, moving a full-time position to part-time and not filling a full-time position. In addition, some personal payroll protection funds were received. The result is that ministry has continued.

Rev. Dr. Timothy Baer drew attention to the report in the workbook going over what could be found in the report. He then drew attention to CF&A's recommendations. He also pointed out that the first part is the Plan for Funding Ministry which proposes a reduction of just over one million dollars.

Rev. Dr. Baer stated that the first action that needed to be taken was a vote to elect Mr. Mark Knecht as Conference Treasurer, Director of Administrative Services, and Benefits Officer. Because Mr. Mark Knecht was hired after the 2019 Annual Conference and the 2020 Annual Conference has been delayed for several months, Mr. Mark Knecht has been employed for about one and a quarter year with this being the first time Annual Conference action could be taken. A list of Mr. Mark Knecht's qualifications was described. The Council on Finance and Administration moves the election of Mr. Mark Knecht as Conference Treasurer, Director of Administrative Services, and Benefits Officer. This motion comes from a conference council, so it does not need a second. Having no questions raised, Bishop Park called for the vote. It was **approved**.

The Council on Finance and Administration then moved for the approval of its recommended benevolence goals, which appear on page 51 of the conference workbook. This motion comes from a conference council, so it does not need a second. Having no questions raised, Bishop Park called for the vote. It was **approved**.

The Council on Finance and Administration then moved for the approval of its recommended Special Sunday offerings, which appear on page 51 of the conference workbook. This motion comes from a conference council, so it does not need a second. Having no questions raised, Bishop Park called for the vote. It was **approved**.

The Council on Finance and Administration moved that motions coming from the conference floor to add expenditures to the conference budget must include a specific and equal subtraction from another line in the budget. A point of order was raised by Rev. L. Fitzgerald Reist, II. The Bishop clarified that the motion applies only to the 2021 budget and the point of order does not apply. This motion comes from a conference council, so it does not need a second. Having no further questions, Bishop Park called for the vote. It was **approved**.

The Council on Finance and Administration has moved approval of its general recommendations. This motion comes from a conference council, so it does not need a second. Having no questions raised, Bishop Park called for the vote. It was **approved**.

Rev. Dr. Timothy Baer stated that over the past few years CF&A proposed, and the Annual Conference approved, a flatlined spending plan. The trend of the Susquehanna Conference has been declining membership, declining church attendance and closed churches making a flatlined spending plan unsustainable in the future, especially since property and health insurance costs continue to rise. CF&A is proposing the 2021 spending plan of \$10,656,310 (ten million six hundred fifty-six thousand three hundred ten dollars) which is \$1,002,170 (one million two thousand one hundred seventy dollars) less than the 2020 spending plan.

The Council on Finance and Administration moved for the approval of the proposed Plan for Funding Ministry for 2021, which begins on page 48 of the conference workbook. A question was raised by Rev. Richard Bender and answered by Rev. Dr. Timothy Baer. A motion was made from Rev. Larry Coleman to move \$1,000 from moving expenses (page 48, line 38, B.2.a) and put \$1,000 into Pennsylvania Council of Churches support (Page 50, line 26, H). The Bishop acknowledged a Second. Rev. Larry Coleman gave a speech for the motion. Pastor T.J. McCabe offered a speech against the motion. Rev. Robert Stump gave a speech for the motion. Rev. Barry Robison offered a speech against the motion. Rev. Dr. Timothy Baer made a final statement. Question by Rev. Renee Ford. Information will be given at a later time.

Pastor Robert Bishard called the question. Vote was taken. It was **approved**.
Vote on Rev. Larry Coleman's motion to move \$1,000 from moving expenses and put \$1,000 into Pennsylvania Council of Churches support. It was **not approved**.

Rev. L. Fitzgerald Reist, II asked for a point of Information. Rev. Dr. Timothy Baer responded.

A motion was made by Rev. Ellen Scamahorn to study the need for ecumenical ministry. The motion was ruled out of order.

A motion was made by Rev. Claire Pennebaker to reduce the health benefits of those on Medical Leave by 20%. Ruled out of Order because of mandate in *The Book of Discipline*.

Rev. Ryan Gephart called for the question. It was **approved**.

The Motion to approve the CF&A's proposed 2021 Plan for Funding Ministry was before the body. Bishop Park called for the vote. It was **approved**.

Rev. Dr. Timothy Baer moved the adoption of the entire report of CF&A. This motion comes from a conference council, so it does not need a second. Having no questions raised, Bishop Park called for the vote. It was **approved**.

Rev. Dr. Timothy Baer offered words of thanks to the Council for their hard and dedicated work. He also thanked the staff in the Conference Finance office and Mr. Mark Knecht. He also thanked the laity and clergy who make it all possible.

Bishop Park offered his thanks to CF&A and the capable and dedicated leadership of Rev. Dr. Timothy Baer.

Bishop Park gave encouragement to the body for their work in the morning session and called upon Ms. Joyce Davis, the new Conference Lay Leader, to offer grace for the meal after which the Annual Conference took a lunch break.

Worshipful Work Session II

Saturday Afternoon, October 3, 2020

Bishop Park welcomed the body back after the lunch break. He then adjourned the ecclesiastical session. and called Rev. Mark Shover, president of the Conference Board of Trustees, to deliver the Trustees report.

The ecclesiastical session was adjourned for corporate session.

The Corporate Session adjourned, and Ecclesiastical Session was reconvened.

Board of Trustees Report to Ecclesiastical Session

Bishop Park reconvened the ecclesiastical session of the Annual Conference and called on Rev. Mark Shover, chair of the Board of Trustees.

On behalf of the Board of Trustees, Mark Shover moved that the ecclesiastical session of the Susquehanna Annual Conference approve, confirm, and support the actions of today's corporate session. Second recognized by Bishop Park. Having no questions raised, Bishop Park called for the vote. It was **approved**.

Rev. Mark Shover recognized and thanked Rev. Dr. Richard Felty and Ms. Margaret Dobb as they complete their service on the Board of Trustees. The Board of Trustees will meet virtually on Monday, October 5, 2020 for the annual reorganizational meeting.

Bishop Park thanked Rev. Mark Shover and the Board of Trustees for their work, faithfulness, and willingness to offer their expertise.

Bishop Park thanked those who were participating in the online conference and their patience.

Advance Specials

Bishop Park called on Rev. Andrew Burd-Harris, the chair of the Conference Board of Global Ministries, to present the list of proposed Advance Specials. The Bishop explained that the mission programs that receive conference Advance Special status may contact our churches directly about the ways they can support their life-transforming ministries.

Rev. Andrew Burd-Harris explained that the Board of Global Ministries is a merger of the former Mission Outreach team and the former Missional Board. He described the work of the Board of Global Ministries. He then described the reason for Advance Specials. He pointed out that the numbers listed next to the Advanced Specials can be used to identify them when submitting donations to the Conference.

Rev. Andrew Burd-Harris moved to adopt these Advance Specials, on behalf of the Board of Global Missions. This motion comes from a conference council, so it does not need a second. Having no questions raised, Bishop Park called for the vote. It was **approved**.

Bishop Park thanked Rev. Andrew Burd-Harris and stated that we are indeed, all of us, partners in mission. We are one in mission to all the world. He gave thanks to God for the partnership with the church alive in Christ in mission.

Bishop Park then called for a break.

Historical Questions

Bishop Park reconvened the conference and explained that at the executive session, provisional member clergy who have been approved for ordination by the Board of Ordained Ministry were voted into full membership as elders in the Annual Conference. Usually, ordination is held during Annual Conference session. This year, it will be live streamed on November 7th because of COVID-19 pandemic restrictions.

Bishop Park met with the ordinands in September and asked John Wesley's historic questions for ordination. Because these are usually asked before the annual conference session, the video of the examinations was shown.

Celebrations

Bishop Park thanked the body for their participation in a new way of caring for the essential business of the Annual Conference.

Bishop Park continued by pointing out that the other services we normally celebrate together each year are the Memorial Service and the Celebration of Ministry Service. The groups that would have been honored this year will be added to the group that will be honored during next year's Conference. He then called on the District Superintendents to read the names of those who died in 2019-2020 as a time of remembrance.

Bishop Park called on the District Superintendents to read the list of those who retired. After the list was read, he gave thanks to God for their service and prayed that their time in retirement be a blessing to them and their loved ones.

Thank Yous

Bishop Park began by thanking the District Superintendents that will be serving in the coming year: Rev. Dr. Joleen Willis, who will lead the Altoona District; Rev. Barry Robison, who will lead the Harrisburg District; Rev. Dr. Gary Weaver, who will lead the Lewisburg District; Rev. Judy Walker, who will lead the Scranton/Wilkes-Barre District; Rev. Brenda Leigey, who will lead the State College District; Rev. Dr. Paul Amara, who will lead the Williamsport District; and Rev. Cathy Boileau, who will lead the York District. He thanked them for their willingness to serve as the "mission strategists" of the Annual Conference. He asked for God's blessing on their ministries.

Bishop Park then thanked the members of the extended cabinet, Rev. Kevin Witt, Director of Growing Spiritually Transformational Leaders and Camping and Retreat Ministries and Rev. Dr. Thomas Salsgiver, Clergy Assistant to the Bishop.

Bishop Park introduced some new members of the Full Cabinet: Rev. Gary Shockley, Director of Equipping Vital Congregations; Mr. Mark Knecht, Conference Treasurer, Director of Administrative Services, and Benefits Officer; and Rev. Victoria Rebeck, Director of Connecting Ministries.

Bishop Park then recognized and thanked those who moved from the cabinet this year: Rev. Dr. Kathleen Kind, who served the Altoona District, is now pastor of Camp Hill UMC; Rev. Larry Leland, who served the Lewisburg District, is now pastor at Faith UMC in Montoursville; Rev. Troy Howell, who served the Williamsport District, is now pastor First UMC in Hershey; and Rev. Dr. Charles Salisbury, who served the York District, is now pastor at Grace UMC in Hummelstown.

Bishop Park also recognized Rev. Greg Myers, who served as a Clergy Assistant to the Bishop, and has taken a non-Cabinet role working with Clergy Records. The Bishop thanked Rev. Greg Myers for his non-anxious presence.

Bishop Park then introduced the new Conference Lay Leader, Ms. Joyce Davis. He thanked Mr. John Konieczny for his wise and compassionate presence as our lay leader for the past eight years.

Bishop Park acknowledged the presence of Mr. Ray Hamill, Conference Chancellor. He thanked Ms. Lauren Hokamp, who served as legal counsel.

Setting of Appointments

Bishop Park stated that the pastors who assumed new appointments as of July 1, 2020, are listed on the conference web site. He then declared those appointments set. He then offered prayer for those changing appointments, and for the ministry of all God's people.

More Thanks

Bishop Park concluded his thanks by acknowledging with gratitude the leadership of the Sessions Committee and Rev. Dr. Gary Weaver, the chair of the committee, as they planned how to adapt Annual Conference session to an online platform.

He continued his thanks for those who provided crucial assistance: the proctors who helped to field questions, Rev. Dr. Kathleen Kind, Rev. Jason Mackey, and Rev. Marian Hartman; Rev. Jennifer Williams, parliamentarian; Mrs. Cindy Weaver, conference secretary; the conference communications staff – Ms. Janelle Walker, Mrs. Stacy Eckert, and Mrs. Sandii Peiffer; the conference information technology team- Mr. Nate Smith and Mr. Larry McCleaf; Mrs. Sarah Filizzi, the conference registrar who worked tirelessly with GNTV; Ms. Amy Wynn, whose commitment to detail and excellence ensured that important matters were cared for; Mrs. Mollye Inners, conference receptionist; Rev. Dr. Thomas Salsgiver and Rev. Gregory Myers, who have provided invaluable assistance to the Bishop and whose experience helped make good decisions for this year's session; and Mrs. Christy Mackey, Bishop Park's executive assistant, who manages many details and brings perspective to the shared work as a conference.

Bishop Park expressed his gratitude for the hospitality of Camp Hill United Methodist Church.

Bishop Park concluded his thank you's by thanking all the body for their work. He stated that, "New things are not always easy, change is not always easy, and what we did here today is far from 'the way we've always done it.' But God calls us to do new things all the time. We are called to be God's hands and feet in the world and in the past six months we've had to do that in very new and different way." Thanks be to God.

Bishop Park offered prayers of thanksgiving and prayers of healing.

Setting of 2021 Annual Conference

The next annual conference will take place June 3-5, 2021, at the Hershey Lodge, God willing.

Adjourning Motion, Lord's Prayer and Benediction.

Bishop Park called on Rev. Barry Robison, who moved to adjourn the 2020 Session of the Susquehanna Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church acknowledging that the body has accepted and completed all the work that was set before us. Bishop Park recognized a second. It was **approved**.

Following the adjournment, Bishop Park lead the body in The Lord's Prayer and offered a benediction.
